

ROAD IMPACTS FOR ATB TOUR OF ALBERTA SEPTEMBER 1, 2017

CHEER ON THE WORLD'S BEST CYCLISTS

Surrounded by Alberta's majestic Rocky Mountains, the 2017 ATB Tour of Alberta will kick-off the first stage of racing with an epic return to the mountains in Jasper National Park on September 1, 2017.

Starting the race by heading out on Hazel Avenue, the race includes a three-lap circuit through the incredible Icefields Parkway south on HWY 93A to Athabasca Falls, then north on HWY 93 back to HWY 93A where the lap repeats. After the 3-lap circuit, the race will head up Marmot Road and will conclude with a breathtaking mountain top finish at one of Alberta's premier winter destinations for skiing and snowboarding, Marmot Basin.

Come cheer on the world's best cyclists and join in the fun at the start or finish line, along the route, or in the Jasper festival.

CLOSURES AND TRAFFIC IMPACT

Road closures on September 1 will be kept to a minimum using rolling closures wherever possible:

- Rolling closures will take place on Highway 93 and Highway 93A between 10:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Traffic will move at the pace of the cyclists, approximately 40 km/h.
- Cavell Road will be closed at 8 a.m. and will reopen at 3 p.m.
- Marmot Road will be closed at 1:30 p.m. and will reopen at 4:00 p.m.
- The parking lot and access to Horseshoe Lake will be closed at 6 a.m. and will reopen at 2:30 p.m.

NOTE:

All southbound traffic must use HWY 93A; all northbound traffic must use HWY 93. Please note that bike and foot access will be allowed. Plan your travel early in the morning to avoid congestion from the ATB Tour of Alberta between the hours of 10:00am and 2:30pm, particularly along the Icefields Parkway (Hwy 93 and 93A).
