Shaw Go WiFi Council held a brief discussion on the proposal by Shaw to install free wifi in the

Municipality. Council received responses to questions through the public engagement process. Applications for Economic Development Fund

Council received applications for the Economic Development Fund from the Jasper Pride Festival Society, IOTAD Habitat for the Arts, and Jasper Heritage Folk and Blues Festival for a total of \$11,650. Council discussed funding available (\$5,000). The fund has two separate rounds for applications – March and September.

Councillor Nesbitt questioned the status of the Economic Development Reserve Fund with \$15,000. Acting Finance and Administration Director, Lavinia Henderson will clarify amount available and applications will be presented at the May 5th regular meeting by way of motion.

Minister's Awards for Municipal Excellence Council discussed the possibility of making a nomination for the Minister's Awards in Municipal Excellence. Five categories are available:

Innovation Award – recognizes a leading practice embodying the first use of an idea in a municipal context in Alberta.

Larger Municipalities Award – recognizes the creative practices developed by municipalities with a population over 500,000.

Partnership Award – recognizes a leading municipal practice involving consultation, co-ordination, and co-operation with other municipalities, jurisdictions, or organizations.

Smaller Municipal Award – recognizes the innovative practices developed by communities with less than 3,000 residents.

Safe Communities Award – recognizes a leading practice that promotes or improves public safety in municipalities.

Outstanding Achievement Award – recognizes a municipality or municipal partnership that has helped to inspire action and change that has benefitted local government practices in Alberta. This award, selected by a review committee, recognizes the best submission from the other categories.

Deadline for nominations is May 29th. Communications Manager Christine Nadon was requested to look into this and report back to Council.

Mayor's Award for the Arts Raven about the Arts Mayor's award for the Arts will be referred to the next Committee meeting, May 12.

Councillor Arsenault advised that she will attend the Alberta Library Conference May 1-3 at Jasper Park lodge, and will also attend a meeting of the Library Trustees Association.

Councillor Wall advised that a memorial will be held for Ernie Wheele on Saturday, May 2nd in Jasper. Also, all councillors, CAO and Communications manager will attend the Advocacy training in Canmore May 14/15.

Mayor Ireland advised that the Thinking Mountains conference will be held May 5th where the Mayor will bring formal greetings and welcoming remarks.

Mayor Ireland also advised that he will present the "State of the Municipality" address at the Chamber meeting May 12th.

Councillor Damota advised that the Communities in Bloom committee requires a new chairman as the previous chairman has stepped down. Also, a CFS meeting is scheduled for April 29th.

CAO Mark Fercho advised that the sidewalk seating pilot programme is going very well. Waiting for Parks approval. Sixteen applicants. One negative comment from a resident regarding perceived congestion on sidewalks in summer.
